On the final morning, we enter through the **Sun Gate at sunrise**, watching Machu Picchu reveal itself below—an experience that never fails to move even the most seasoned travelers.

We wrap up in the **Sacred Valley**, exploring Ollantaytambo before continuing on to **Lima**, where excellent food and coastal culture provide a fitting finale.

Monday, June 22

## Cusco Highlights & Sacred Sites → Soraypampa

Tuesday, June 23



After breakfast, set out on a guided tour of **Cusco** and its surrounding archaeological sites. Visit the impressive hilltop ruins of **Sacsayhuamán**, followed by **Qenqo**, **Puka Pukara**, and **Tambomachay**, with a possible glimpse of **Inti Raymi** rehearsals if timing allows.

Continue into the historic center to explore **Koricancha**, located within Santo Domingo Church,

and the **Cusco Cathedral**, built atop an original Inca palace.

Enjoy time to wander **San Pedro Market**, experiencing everyday local life, before lunch in the artistic neighborhood of **San Blas**.

In the afternoon, return to the hotel for a trekking briefing and gear check before departing Cusco for a scenic **3–3.5 hour drive to Soraypampa**.

Arrive at **EcoCamps Soraypampa** for an overnight stay in eco-domes. **Dinner included.**

## Salkantay Trek Begins: Soraypampa → Ichupata

Wednesday, June 24



The Salkantay Trek begins in **Soraypampa**, where you'll meet the horse crew and set out toward **Ichupata**. The trail climbs steadily through classic high-Andean terrain, with wide-open views of surrounding peaks and glaciers. A hot lunch is served along the route before the final ascent to camp.

Arrive at **Ichupata Camp** in the late afternoon, settle in, and enjoy dinner at altitude as you prepare for the challenging and rewarding days ahead.

### Trekking details:

- Duration: 4–5 hours
- Distance: 7.5 km
- Elevation: 3,875 m → 4,500 m

## Crossing Incachiriasca Pass: Ichupata → Paucarcancha

Thursday, June 25



Leaving **Ichupata**, the route tackles one of the most dramatic and demanding days of the trek. The trail climbs beneath the towering presence of **Salkantay Peak**, ascending to **Incachiriasca Pass**, where sweeping views open across two striking glacial lakes.

From the pass, begin a long descent through changing landscapes and into broader valleys, arriving at **Paucarcancha Camp** in the late afternoon.

**Trekking details:**

- Duration: 8–9 hours
- Distance: 19.8 km
- Elevation: 4,948 m → 3,122 m

**Joining the Inca Trail: Paucarcancha → Km 82**

Friday, June 26



The day begins with a scenic descent along an ancient **Inca trail** toward the village of **Huayllabamba**, where you officially join the **Classic Inca Trail to Machu Picchu**. The route follows the Patallaqta stream before continuing onward to **Km 82**, the traditional starting point of the Inca Trail.

From here, transfer to **Ecoinka Casitas Glamping** for a comfortable overnight stay surrounded by nature.

**Trekking details:**

- Duration: 4–5 hours
- Distance: 12 km
- Elevation: 3,122 m → 2,657 m

**Inca Trail Finale: Km 104 → Wiñay Wayna → Machu Picchu**

Saturday, June 27





The day begins with a transfer from **Ecoinka Casitas Glamping** to the train for the ride to **Km 104**, where you officially begin the Inca Trail following passport and permit checks with park rangers. From here, hike approximately three hours along a stunning stretch of trail to the remarkably preserved ruins of **Wiñay Wayna**, passing waterfalls, native flora, and Andean birdlife along the way.

After lunch and time to explore Wiñay Wayna's terraces, temples, and towers, continue onward to **Inti Punku** for your first unforgettable view of **Machu Picchu**. From here, follow the final ridge into the citadel for an initial orientation and overview of this iconic site.

In the late afternoon, descend by shuttle bus to **Aguas Calientes**, where you'll overnight. **Dinner included at your hotel.**

**Trekking details:**

- Duration: 5–6 hours
- Distance: 9 km
- Elevation: 2,100 m → 2,900 m

**Machu Picchu Guided Visit & Scenic Rail Return**

Sunday, June 28



Meet your guide and travel by shuttle bus to the main entrance of **Machu Picchu**. Enjoy a guided tour of the sanctuary's principal areas, following **Circuit 2A or 2B**, with expert insight into Inca history, architecture, and daily life.

After the visit, enjoy a buffet lunch at the **Sanctuary Lodge**. In the afternoon, descend by bus to **Aguas Calientes** and board the **Vistadome Train** for a scenic return to **Ollantaytambo**.

## Sacred Valley Highlights → Lima

Monday, June 29



Depart the Sacred Valley and explore **Ollantaytambo**, one of the most remarkable surviving Inca towns. Once a key fortress during the Spanish invasion, the site showcases the empire's military, religious, and agricultural ingenuity, including the **Temple of the Sun**, the **Ten Niches (Hornacinas)**, and the **Ñusta Baths**.

Continue to **Pisac** for lunch at **Cuchara de Palo**, followed by a guided visit to the Inca citadel. Explore sweeping agricultural terraces, residential and ceremonial sectors, the **Intihuatana (Sun Dial)**, defensive towers, and what is considered the largest pre-Columbian cemetery in the Americas.

In the afternoon, transfer to **Cusco Airport** for your flight to **Lima**. Upon arrival, receive assistance and check in to your airport-adjacent hotel for a convenient overnight stay.
